INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

The Visiting Fellows Program at the [National Europe Centre](#) supports local and international scholars wishing to undertake research at the ANU, as part of its mission to promote research, education and dialogue between Europe in Australia. The program aims to have 3–4 visiting scholars each year. Visiting Fellows must be in residence at The Australian National University for the duration of their appointment.

Each year the Centre announces broad research themes which relate to Centre projects. Applications from scholars interested in these themes from any discipline are welcomed. Themes being developed during 2008 include:

Peace, Security and Terrorism

Environment, Risk and Certainty

Citizenship, Migration and Identity

Europe-Australia Trade

The EU in the Asia-Pacific

While priority is accorded to applications addressing these themes, proposals outside these themes will also be considered.

Visiting Fellows will be invited to participate in Centre's programs, including the Centre's seminars, roundtables, workshops and conferences ([see here for further information](#)). The Centre has links with other Australian and New Zealand EU Centres — [Monash European and EU Centre](#) (Monash University), the Innovative Universities European Union Centre ([La Trobe](#) University, Macquarie University, Newcastle University, Flinders University, Murdoch University and Griffith University), the National Centre for Research on Europe (University of Canterbury) and the European Union

Centres Network (University of Auckland, University of Waikato, Massey University, Victoria University of Wellington, Lincoln University, University of Otago) — and the [Contemporary Europe Research Centre](#) (CERC) at The University of Melbourne.

Types of Fellowship

Visiting Fellow (with grant)

This Fellowship is for a period between one and six months. The grants can be used towards accommodation at the University and airfares for the Visiting Fellow. The maximum contribution for travel is AUD\$3,500. This financial assistance for travel and accommodation expenses is not a salary replacement. We particularly encourage applications from people willing to teach into the National Europe Centre's intensive Master's course, *The European Union: regionalism and integration in comparative perspective*.

Visiting Fellow (with partial grant)

This Fellowship is intended for scholars within Australia and New Zealand who wish to undertake research at the Centre. The grant is to assist with travel expenses.

Visiting Fellow (without grant)

Academic staff from The Australian National University, other universities and institutions may apply to use the facilities at the Centre during periods of research leave (e.g. sabbatical).

National Europe Centre Visitor

Short-term visitors, who wish to participate in the National Europe Centre's program of activities, may apply at any time to visit the Centre. Participants may apply for reimbursement of travel and/or accommodation costs.

National Europe Centre Visiting Scholar

This scholarship of \$5000 is aimed at current PhD students and junior academics within two years of the completion of their doctoral studies. This financial assistance is for travel and accommodation.

Centre Facilities

The National Europe Centre is located at 1 Liversidge Street, on the Acton Peninsula at The Australian National University. Visiting Fellows are entitled to access all University facilities, such as libraries, health services etc. Offices are equipped with networked computers that provide access to the Internet and email. The Centre also provides some administrative support and assistance. Further information about the programs, staff and facilities is contained on this [website](#).

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Application Form

Applicants should submit a completed application form, together with a CV and list of publications and/or professional activities. Downloadable [application form](#)

2. Project Proposal

Applicants should provide a one page description of their planned research project (information on the [application form](#)).

3. Referees' Reports

Applicants need to provide the names of two referees who will support their application. Referees should submit their confidential report separately to the National Europe Centre on the form provided, by the closing date of that Call for Applications. Downloadable [referee report form](#)
